

Subdivisions of T. 32 N., R. 44 E.

Chains

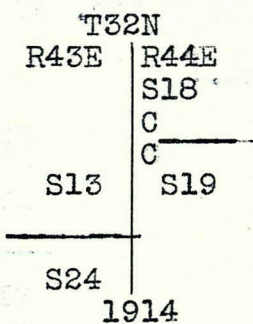
and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high,  
N. of cor.

59.30 Bottom of canyon, 180 ft. below top of ridge, course  
N.  $20^\circ$  E.; ascend.

71.80 Top of spur, 330 ft. above bottom of canyon, bears N. and  
S.; descend

83.61 Intersect the west boundary of the township, 1.82 chs. N.  
of the cor. of secs. 13 and 24 of T. 32 N., R. 43 E.  
which is an iron post heretofore described. At the  
point of intersection I build a cor. as follows:

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the  
ground for the closing cor. of secs. 18 and 19, with  
brass cap mkd.:

E. of cor.

Land, rolling foothills.

Soil, rocky clay loam, barren ledges.

Undergrowth, sage and desert brush, some bunch grass.

No timber.

Surveyed by A.T.Harris:-

July 11, 1914: At 8h. 50m., a.m., l.m.t., I set off  $40^\circ$   
 $37\frac{1}{2}'$  N. on the lat. arc;  $22^\circ 10'$  N. on the decl. arc;  
and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of  
secs. 17, 18, 19 and 20.

Thence I run.

N.  $0^\circ 03'$  W. bet. secs. 17 and 18

Over rolling valley land, descend.

12.25 Cross gulch, course N.  $45^\circ$  E.; ascend.
