

8. Retracement of the N. Bdy. of T. 32 N., R. 48 East.

Chains

4.57 From the cor. of secs. 6 and 7 on the W. bdy. I retrace N. on the W. bdy. of sec. 6. Intersect E. and W. line, at the cor. of secs. 1 and 12, of T. 32 N., R. 47 E., which is a granite stone 5x6x12 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General. I continue my retracement N. along same line.

39.59 Intersect E. and W. line, 2 lks. E. of the $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of sec. 6, which is a granite stone, 8x10x14 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General. The course of this $\frac{1}{2}$ mile is therefore N. $0^{\circ} 02' W$. (For obliteration of this corner see page 45.)

44.22 I continue my retracement along same line. Intersect E. and W. line; 3 lks. E. of the $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of sec. 1, which is a sandstone; 3x10x18 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General. I continue my retracement along same line. (For change of this cor. see page 45)

84.40 Intersect E. and W. line, 14 lks. E. of pits and mound of earth, No traces of the old post corner found. I reestablish the corner at the center of the mound of earth, after verifying the position of the pits and mound of earth by retracements N., E. and W, Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of T. 32 N. and 33 N., R. 47 E. and 48 E., with brass cap mkd:

dig pits 24x24x12 ins., on each line N., E. and W. and 4 ft., and S. of post, 8 ft. dist. and raise a mound of earth 5 ft. base, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high S. of corner. The course of line from $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. for sec. 6 is N. $0^{\circ} 09' W$.

RETRACEMENT OF THE N. BDY. OF T. 32 N., R. 48 EAST

Retraced by A.T.Harris
July 23, 1914: At 8h. 15m., a.m.; 1.m.t, I set off $40^{\circ} 40' N$. on the lat. arc; $20^{\circ} 11' N$. on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, on the N. bdy. which is a volcanic rock, 6x18x22 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General. Thence I retrace

40.00 West bet, secs. 2 and 35. Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. No traces of the old cor. are found after diligent search. I continue my retracement W. along same line.

80.00 Set temp. point for the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35. No traces of the old cor. are found after careful search.
