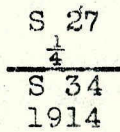


Chains and raise a mound of stone, 2ft. base, 1½ ft. high W. of corner.  
 43.50 Low ridge, course N. 45°E. and S.45°W.  
 46.00 Wagon road, bears N. 45° E. and S.45°W.  
 65.00 Wash, 10 lks. wide, course N.50°E.; ascend gradually.  
 82.02 The cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, on the N. Bdy., heretofore described.  
 Land, rolling foothills. Soil, gravelly and stony light ash and clay loam, mixed and covered with loose volcanic rocks. Undergrowth, sage and desert brush, greasewood, No timber. Land, not suitable for agriculture.

Resurvey by H. W. Reppert.  
 July 24, 1914. At 7h. 45m. a.m., l.m.t., I set off 40° 36'N. on the lat. arc; 19° 59'N. on the decl. arc; determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35, heretofore described.

Thence I run  
 W. on a true line bet. secs. 27 and 34.  
 Over level land.

22.30 Wire fence, bears S. 31° 35'W. and N.31° 35'E.  
 40.00 Reestablished the ¼ cor. as follows:  
 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the ground for ¼ sec. cor., with brass cap marked



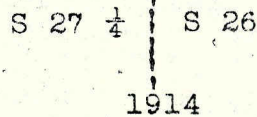

SUBDIVISIONS OF T. 32 N., R. 48 EAST

Surveyed by A.T. Harris.  
 July 25, 1914. At 8h. 00m. a.m., l.m.t., I set off 40° 36'N. on lat. arc; 19° 46½'N. on decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35.

Thence I run  
 North on a true line bet. secs. 26 and 27.  
 Over level bottom land.

33.60 Wire fence, bears N.60°E. and S.60°W.  
 40.00 Reestablish the ¼ cor. of secs. 26 and 27, as follows:  
 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the ground for ¼ sec. cor., with brass cap marked



and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high W. of corner.  
 A portion of the subdivisional lines on the East of this tier of secs. being out of limits I run from this ¼ cor. North on Sectional Guide Meridian.  
 Gradually ascend.
