General Description.

The eastern portion of this township is rough and mountainous, while the western portion is level. There are several different kinds of soil in this township, ranging from adobe soil, containing alkali, in the extreme W. portion, to rich loam in some of the draws. Over most of the ridges, there is very little soil, what there is, being very rocky. Solid rock and slide rock covers a great deal of the surface. What soil there is in the mountains, is composed of decomposed rock and vegetable matter and is very rich. On the W. slope of the foothills, the soil is coarse and stony, gradually becoming less stony and finer toward the level land. There is some loose, drifting sand on the level portions, but
