 Over rough mountainous land, through moderately heavy timber.

27.40 Top of spur, 370 ft. above cor., slopes N.  
 Descend 350 ft. to  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.

Supports a scattering and heavy growth of piñon pine, cedar, mountain mahogany, and fir timber. A little very good saw timber. Undergrowth of sage and service brush. Good bit of grass.
