80.00 Find no trace of the old cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31, and 36, after diligent search.

North, on a retracement line bet. secs. 25 and 30.

40.00 Find no trace of the old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., after diligent search.

80.00 Find no trace of the old cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25, and 30, after diligent search.

Set temp. sec. cor. point.

North, on a retracement line bet. secs. 19 and 24.

40.00 Find no trace of the old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., after diligent search.

80.03 The cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19, and 24, which is a partially decayed willow stake, 2 ins. sq., 2 ft. long loose on the ground, with no marks which can be read, but which is in my opinion the old original cor. Alongside of it is a cedar post 3 ins. square, 3 ft. long, marked with 3 notches on each of two opposite edges. I reset both posts, 12 ins. deep.

The measurement shows the three miles to the south to be each, 80.01 chs. long. The true point for the cor.
