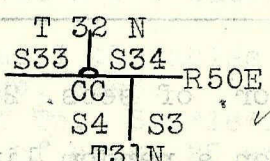


26. Subdivision of T. 32 N., R. 50 E.

Chains.  
 73.28 The cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35, 125 ft. above bottom of draw.  
 Land; rolling mountainous.  
 Soil; rocky, light, sandy clay loam, about 2 or 3 ft. deep, lying on hard-pan.  
 Undergrowth; dense sagebrush.  
 Fair growth of bunch grass.  
 Drainage SW.  
 Southern exposure.  
 No timber.

S.0°02'E. bet. secs. 33 and 34.  
 Over mountainous land.  
 Asc. on N. slope of ridge, through dense sagebrush.  
 16.80 Ridge, 40 ft. above sec. cor., bears N.80°E. and S.80°W., desc.  
 23.20 Hollow, 30 ft. below ridge, course W., asc.  
 40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. for secs. 33 and 34, with brass cap mkd:

 and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, W. of cor.  
 57.00 Ridge, 60 ft. above hollow, bears N.80°E. and S.80°W., desc.  
 72.92 Intersect the S. bdy. of the Tp., 6.07 chs. dist. N.87°07'W. from the reestablished cor. of secs. 3 and 4, hereinbefore described.  
 At point of intersection, set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the closing cor. of secs. 33 and 34, with brass cap mkd:

 and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, N. of cor.  
 Land, mountainous.  
 Soil, clay and gravelly loam, with same subsoil; 2nd. rate.  
 No timber.  
 Undergrowth; dense sagebrush.  
 Good grazing.  
 Drainage S. into Humboldt River.  
 The sky being overcast at noon, I was unable to make an observation for latitude.  
 November 21, 1914

and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, W. of cor.  
 Bottom of draw, 245 ft. below  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., course SW.
