## Retracement of S. Bdy. T. 33 N., R. 50 E.

Chains

40.00 East on a retracement along the S. side of sec. 34. Find no trace of the old  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. after diligent search.

November 5, 1914.

At 7 h 44 m, a.m., l.m.t., I set off  $40^{\circ}39'N.$  on the lat. arc;  $15^{\circ}30'S.$  on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar at the Hatch, Skinner and Preble corner of Tps. 32 and 33 N., Rgs. 49 and 50 E., heretofore described, which I remonument as follows:

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the cor. of Ts. 32 and 33 N., Rgs. 49 and 50 E., with brass cap mkd:

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, S. of cor.

Thence  $S.89^{\circ}58'E.$  on a resurvey along the S. side of Sec. 31.

Over rolling land, thru dense sagebrush.

Asc. gently.

7.00 Top of small ridge, 20 ft. above Tp. cor., bears N. and S.

9.00 Wash, 10 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, course S.

21.50 Wash, 15 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, course S.

38.96 The old  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., heretofore described, which I remonument as follows:

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground, for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, N. of cor.

Thence  $S.89^{\circ}49'E.$

73.90 Top of ridge, 80 ft. above  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., bears N. and S. Desc.

78.92 The old cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, heretofore described, which I re-establish at the same point as follows:

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the cor. of secs. 31 and 32, with brass cap mkd:
