S.0°51'E. on a resurvey along the W. side of sec.5.
Over mountainous land, thru dense undergrowth. Desc.
6.41 The old cor. of secs. 25 and 36, on the E. Bdy. of T. 33
N., R. 50 E., which now becomes an angle point only, and
which I re-monument as follows:

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in
the ground for an angle point, with brass cap mkd:

24.70 and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, W. of cor.
Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in

59.99 The old ¼ sec. cor. on the W. side of Sec.5, T.32 N., R.51
E., heretofore described, which I re-monument at the same
point as follows:

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in
the ground, alongside of stone, for the ¼ sec. cor., with
brass cap mkd:

77.11 The S.E. Cor. of T. 33 N., R. 50 E., established at this

85.18 The old corner of Tps. 32 and 33 N., R. 50 E. heretofore
described, which now becomes an angle point only, and which

RETRACEMENT OF SUBDIVISIONS T.33 N., R.50 E.

October 24, 1914:

At 7 h 44 m, a.m., l.m.t., I set off 40°44'N. on the
lat. arc; 11°34'S. on the decl. arc; and determine a
meridian with the solar at the reestablished corner of
secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, on the N. Bdy. of the Tp.

Thence S.0°12'W. on a retracement between secs. 5 and 6.

40.39 Find no trace of the old ¼ sec. cor. after diligent search.

80.47 Fall 44 lks. E. of the old cor. of secs.5,6,7 and 8,

which is evidenced by an old mound of stone, only. The
marked stone cannot be found. No other evidence of a cor-
ner in this vicinity can be found. The course of this
line is S.0°31'W., and the length 80.47 chs.

October 24, 1914:

At this corner, I set off 11°39'S. on the decl. arc,
and at 11 h 44 m, a.m., l.m.t., observe the sun on the
meridian; the resulting lat. is 40°43'N.
