No timber, except a few aspen trees in each of the two  
canyons noted on line. Some poles and wood have been  
hauled to the valley from these canyons.  
Undergrowth, sagebrush, and some willows along each of  
the spring branches.  
Good grass for grazing.

East on a true line along the S. side of sec. 36.  
Over mountainous land, through dense sagebrush; ascend  
abruptly.

10.50 Ridge, 220 ft. above sec. cor., course N. and S.  
Desc.

18.50 Ravine, 75 ft. below ridge, course N.20°W. Desc.

40.00 Falls on NW. slope of spur, 120 ft. above ravine.  
Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins.  
in the ground for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. with brass cap mkd:

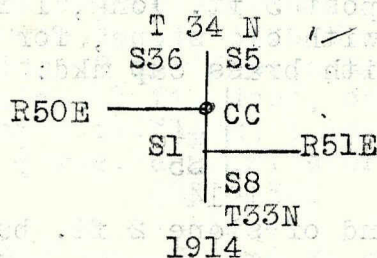

59.76 Intersect W. Bdy. of T.33 N., R. 51 E., at N.0°14'E.,  
10.87 chs. from the cor. of secs. 5 and 8.

Point is 250 ft. below ridge.

At point of intersection, set an iron post 3 ft. long,  
3 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the closing  
corner of Ts. 33 and 34 N., R. 50 E., with brass cap mkd:
