and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, N. of cor.

- 42.43 Hollow, 150 ft. below ridge, course NW. Asc.
- 54.10 Spur of ridge, 300 ft. above hollow, bears N. and S. Desc.
- 61.80 Hollow, 20 ft. above spur, course S.10°W. Asc.

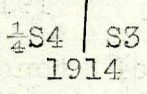
- 66.10 Spur, 30 ft. above hollow, bears NW. and SE. Desc.
- 69.60 Head of swale, 10 ft. below spur, course N.30°W. Asc. abruptly.

80.08 Point 300 ft. above swale.
 The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10.
 Land, mountainous.
 Soil, clay and gravelly loam, and rocky, 2nd and 4th rate.
 No timber.
 Good grass for grazing.
 Undergrowth, sagebrush.
 October 13, 1914:

At this corner, at 11 h 46 m, a.m., l.m.t., I set off 7°40'S. on the decl. arc; and observe the sun on the meridian; the resulting latitude is 40°48'N.

N.0°02'E. on a true line between secs. 3 and 4.
 Over mountainous land, through dense sagebrush; desc. along steep west slope.

- 34.80 Head of hollow, 150 ft. below sec. cor., course SW. Ascend.
- 40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for the ¼ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:

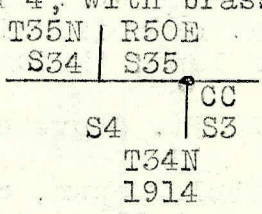


and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, W. of cor.

- 41.00 Ridge, 100 ft. above hollow, bears N.70°E. and S.70°W. Desc.
- 70.30 Head hollow, 150 ft. below ridge, course S.70°W. Asc. abruptly.
- 83.30 Divide ridge, between Maggie Creek and Boulder Valley, 400 ft. above hollow, bears N.20°W. and S.20°E. Desc.

86.90 Intersect N. Bdy. of Tp. at point 17.00 chs. East of the cor. of secs. 34 and 35, T. 35 N., R. 50 E., already described.

At point of intersection set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the closing corner of secs. 3 and 4, with brass cap mkd:
