

Chains

- 206 lks. N. of the Std. Cor. of Secs. 34 and 35; T36NR49E.
Thence East from said point
Over rolling land, through dense sagebrush, along N. side
of small ridge.
- 36.71 Fall 282 lks. N. of the old original C.C. of secs. 1 and
2, which is an old willow stake 2 ins. in dia. and 40
ins. long, lying in a small mound of earth; there are
no signs of marks on the stake; nor traces of pits, but
on account of this corner being fairly consistent with the
corners to the West, I regard it as the original corner.
At 9 h 0 m, a.m., l.m.t., I set off 40°54' on the lat.
arc; 5°07'N. on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian
with the solar at this corner and continue retracing
East on the 7th Std. Parallel, North.
East on the South Bdy. of sec. 35.
- 40.23 Fall 2 lks. S. of the old original Std. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor. of
Sec. 35, which is a stake 2 ins. in dia., 36 ins. long,
with $\frac{1}{4}$ S marked on one face, lying in an old mound,
with faint outline of pits.
- 57.00 Draw, course N.60°W.
- 80.43 Fall 38 lks. N. of the old Std. Cor. of secs. 35 and 36,
which is a stake 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. in dia. and 30 ins. long, with
the letter S faintly visible on one face, lying in an
old mound of earth, with traces of pits.
Land, gently rolling.
Soil, light clay loam, with same subsoil; 2nd rate.
No timber.
Undergrowth, dense sagebrush.
General drainage North, then west.
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- East on the Seventh Std. Par. N., along the south side
of sec. 36.
Over rolling land, through dense sagebrush.
- 2.50 Small hollow, course S.
- 20.00 Spur, 80 ft. above hollow, projects N.
- 29.50 Draw, 40 ft. below spur, course N.50°W.
- 36.55 Fall 23 lks. N. of the Tp. C.C. of Tps. 35 N., Rs. 49
and 50 E., heretofore described.
Land, rolling.
Soil, light clay loam, with same subsoil; 2nd rate.
No timber.
Undergrowth, dense sagebrush.
General drainage W.

RETRACEMENT OF 7th STD. PAR. N. thru R. 50 E.

September 10:

- At 2 h 0 m, p.m., l.m.t., I set off 40°54' on the
lat. arc; 5°02'N. on the decl. arc; and determine a
meridian with the solar at the Closing Corner of T.35
N., Rs. 49 and 50 E.
Thence East on the 7th Std. Parallel North on the
N. Bdy. of sec. 5, on N. Bdy. T.35 N.R.50 E.
- 3.69 Fall 8 lks. S. of an old willow stake, 2 ins. in dia.,
30 ins. long, with $\frac{1}{4}$ marked on one face, lying two-
thirds in the ground, with no trace of pits or mound.
On account of consistency of this stake with the corners
to the west, I regard this stake as the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of
sec. 36.
Thence continuing East on my line from the west.
- 43.95 Fall 83 lks. S. of an old willow stake, 2 ins. in dia.,
and 34 ins. long, with the faint outline of an S, R
and a 3 on two faces of the stake, lying in a mound of
stone. I regard this stake as the Std. Cor. of T.36
N., Rs. 49 and 50 E.
