80.20 Ridge, 250 ft. above gulch, bears NE. and SW., desc.
 82.24 10 ft. below ridge. The cor. of secs. 7 and 18, heretofore described. Land, mountainous.
 Soil, rocky clay loam, 4th rate; subsoil same.
 No timber.
 Undergrowth, dense sagebrush, good grass for grazing.
 Drainage E.

I begin at the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 19, on the E. Bdy. of T. 34 N., R. 51 E., heretofore described.
 Thence South between secs. 19 and 24.

1.89 $\frac{1}{2}$ Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 24, with brass cap mkd:

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor.

August 21: At 12 h 3 m, p.m., l.m.t., I set off $12^{\circ}13'N$ on the decl. arc; and observe the sun on the meridian, the resulting lat. is $40^{\circ}46'$.

From the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. for sec. 18, heretofore described
 Thence $N.0^{\circ}12'E$. between secs. 13 and 18.

1.68 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. for sec. 13, only, with brass cap mkd:

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor.

From the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. for sec. 7, heretofore described,
 Thence $N.0^{\circ}38'E$., between secs. 7 and 12.

1.31 $\frac{1}{2}$ Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. for sec. 12, only, with brass cap mkd:

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor.

RESURVEY OF N. BDY. T. 34 N., R. 51 E.

Aug. 13:

At 7 h 0 m, a.m., l.m.t., I set off $40^{\circ}49'$ on the lat. arc; $14^{\circ}51'N$. on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of Ts. 34 and 35 N., Rs. 51 and 52 E., heretofore described.

Thence West on the North Bdy. of sec. 1.
 Over mountainous land.
