Resurvey of W. Bdy. T. 34 N., R. 51 E.

Chains

follows:

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the cor. of secs. 6 and 7, with brass cap mkd:

T34N
R50E | S6 S7 R51E
1914

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, E. of cor.

The course of this mile is N.0°01'E., and the length 79.88 chs.

Thence S.0°01'W. on a true line between secs. 2 and 7, on a resurvey.

26.73 Over flat land on the W. edge of Maggie Creek Valley. Lincoln Highway, bears N.45°E. and S.40°W., enter rolling land.

39.94 The proportional distance.

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. for sec. 7 only, with brass cap mkd:

1/4 S7
1914

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, E. of cor.

43.83 Draw, course N.45°W., asc.

Enter mountainous land, bears NE. and SW.

71.00 Ridge, 240 ft. above draw, bears N.65°E. and S.60°W., desc.

79.08 Ravine, 110 ft. below ridge, course N.50°E., asc.

79.88 25 ft. above ravine, on N. slope of ridge.

The cor. of secs. 7 and 18, heretofore described.

Land, S. 36.05 chs. mountainous; the remainder rolling and flat.

Soil, light clay loam, 2nd rate; subsoil the same.

Undergrowth, sagebrush.

Drainage E. to Maggie Creek.

August 24, 1914.

May 31, 1916.

Thence N.0°4'E. on a resurvey line, bet. secs. 6 and 36. Over rolling land, thru dense sagebrush, asc. gently.

16.28 The closing cor. of Ts. 34 and 35 N., R. 50 E., herein-after described.

40.00 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. on the W. side of sec. 6, which is an iron post 1 in. in dia., 12 ins. above ground, marked on brass cap:

1/4 S6
1914

with stone mound 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, E. of cor.

43.78 Top of low spur, 20 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bears NW. and SE. Continue gradual ascent.

50.58 Wash, 30 lks. wide, 3 ft. deep, course S.50°E.

56.28 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. for sec. 36 only, marked on brass cap:

1/4 S36
1916

and raise a mound of stone 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor. The cor. is 50 ft. above the low spur.

80.28 The original cor. of Ts. 34 and 35 N., R. 51 E., which was a stake 2 ins. in dia., 30 ins. long in a mound of stone, all markings except the letter "S" on one face of
