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GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

This fractional township contains nearly every variety of land from flat to high rolling and rough mountainous land, and the soil ranges from a light clay loam to a rocky clay loam. The soil in the bottom land, along Maggie, James and Soap Creeks is of a light clay loam, suitable for raising crops with irrigation; the soil of the remaining portion of this fractional township is of a rocky and stony clay loam, not suitable for agriculture, on account of the roughness of the land. The soil of the bottom lands is 1st rate and the soil of the remaining portion of the fractional township could be classed as 2nd and 4th rate and is covered with a growth of sage ranging from 2½ to 5 ft. in height and also has a growth of rich and nutritious grass, which is fine for grazing purposes.
