

Chains

Aug. 6: At 2h. p.m., l.m.t., I set off 40° 43' on the lat. arc; 16° 46' N. on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8 heretofore described.

Thence I run

N. bet. secs. 5 and 6 on a retracement.


Over rolling land through dense sage brush.

22.30 A well beaten cattle trail, bears N. E. and S. W.

39.98 Hollow, 70 ft. below sec. cor., course E.

Fall 42 lks. E. of the old original $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of secs. 5 and 6, which is a stake $1\frac{1}{4}$ ins. in diam., 20 ins. long, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on one face, lying $\frac{1}{2}$ under surface of the earth. I remonument corner as follows:

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of secs. 5 and 6 with brass cap mkd.,

and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high W. of corner.

The course of this half mile therefore is N.0° 36'W.,

39.98 chs. dist.

Thence from this $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. I run

N. bet. secs. 5 and 6.

40.20 Cattle trail bears E. and W.

68.80 Wash, 10 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, course N. 40°E.


71.50 Small spur, projects N. 75°E.

73.05 Cattle trail, bears E. and W.

73.80 Wash, 20 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, course N. 80°E.

83.53 Fall 3.43 chs. W. of the original cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32 which is a cedar stake, 3 ins. by 2 ins. in dia., 3 ft. long, marked with 5 notches on E. and 1 notch on W. edge, T 34 N S 32 on N.E. face, R 52 E S 5 on S.E. face, T 33 N S 6 on S.W. face, and S 31 on N W face, I remonument cor. as follows:

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground for the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, with brass cap mkd.,

and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high W. of corner.

The course and dist. of this half mile is N.4° 31'E.

43.69 chs. dist.

Land; rolling.
Soil; rocky and gravelly clay loam, 3rd. rate, subsoil same.

No timber.

Undergrowth, dense sagebrush, good grass for grazing.
