

4. Resurvey of Frac: S. Bdy. of T.29 N., R.52 E.

Chains

Soil, dry, medium texture, sandy and gravelly loam, from 1 to 3 ft. in depth, 1st rate but too dry for cultivation.

Good growth of sagebrush, considerable grass, weeds and other feed.

No timber. Good grazing land.

East between secs. 1 and 36.

Over rolling table land.

12.50 Foot of mountain spur, bears NE. and SW. Asc.

31.10 Rounding mountain spur, slopes S., 115 ft. above foot. Descend.

34.50 Draw, course SW., 60 ft. below spur. Ascend.

38.10 Mountain spur, slopes SW., 45 ft. above draw. Descend.

40.00 In a draw, course SW., 40 ft. below spur. The old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. I destroy all trace of this corner and its accessories and reestablish it at the same point as follows:

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, N. of cor.

40.70 Small wash, course SW.

42.40 Small spur, slopes SW., 45 ft. above draw.

59.40 Wash, course SW., 110 ft. below spur. Ascend.

80.00 The old cor. of Tps. 28 and 29 N., Rs. 52 and 53 E., heretofore described. On N.W. slope of a low spur, 130 ft. above wash.

I destroy all traces of this corner and its accessories and reestablish it at the same point as follows:

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the cor. of Tps. 28 and 29 N., Rgs. 52 and 53 E., with brass cap mkd:

Good growth sagebrush, considerable grass, weeds and other feed. Good grazing land.

June 3, 1915.

At the cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34, on the S. Bdy. of the township, at 8 h 0 m a.m., l.m.t., I set off $40^{\circ}19'N.$ on the lat. arc, $22^{\circ}15'N.$ on the decl. arc, and determine a meridian with the solar.

Thence I retrace

North between secs. 33 and 34.

40.00 I search diligently but find no $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

80.00 Find the old cor. of secs. 27, 28, 33 and 34, falling
