

Resurvey of S. Bdy. T. 32 N., R. 52 E.

7.

Chains

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. for sec. 6, with brass cap mkd:

$$\frac{1}{4} S 6$$

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, S. of cor.

Ascend gradually.

41.98 Small rocky spur, slopes NW., 15 ft. above corner.

Descend W. slope.

49.61 Wide draw, course SW., 160 ft. below spur. Ascend SE. slope.

69.36 Large mountain spur, slopes S., 170 ft. above draw.

Descend SW. slope.

79.26 160 ft. below spur.

The cor. of T. 31 N., Rgs. 51 and 52 E.

I destroy all trace of this corner and its accessories and reestablish it at the same point as follows:

Set an iron post. 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the cor. of Ts. 31 N., Rgs. 51 and 52 E., with brass cap mkd:

$$\begin{array}{c} T 32 N \\ R51E | R52E \\ \hline S1 | S6 \\ T31N \end{array}$$

$$\begin{array}{c} R51E R52E \\ 1915 \end{array}$$

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, S. of cor.

Land, high, rocky, rough, volcanic mountains with a general southerly slope. Much slide and loose rocks, and rocks in place.

Soil; very dry, coarse texture, rocky and gravelly, 4th rate. Not much sagebrush or other feed. Too rocky for good grazing. No timber. Practically worthless.

At the cor. of Ts. 31 N., Rgs. 51 and 52 E., at about 11 h 58 m a.m., l.m.t., I set off $6^{\circ}16'N$. on the decl. arc, and observe the sun on the meridian, the resulting latitude is $40^{\circ}35'N$.

I now proceed to the cor. of secs. 1 and 2, T.31 N., R.51 E., and resurvey

East on the north bdy. of sec. 1.

15.88 The S.E. cor. of T.32 N., R. 51 E.

I change this corner to the cor. of T.32 N., Rgs. 51 and 52 E., by marking it with 6 notches on the E. edge and changing the witnessing mound of stone to N. of the cor.

It is now a volcanic stone 12x6 ins. by 10 ins. above ground, firmly set in the ground, marked with 6 notches on the N., E. and W. edges; and T 32 N R 51 E on the NW. face, and witnessed by a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high N. of cor.

Thence $N.89^{\circ}25'E$.

17.46 Ravine, course SW. 15 ft. below corner. Ascend gradually.

21.96 Ridge, bears NE. and SW., 30 ft. above ravine. Descend gradually.

24.96 Ravine, course S. 10 ft. below ridge. Ascend gradually.

34.86 Low spur, slopes S. 90 ft. above ravine. Descend gradually.

37.86 Ravine, course SW. 25 ft. below spur. Ascend gradually.

40.00 The old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

I destroy all trace of this corner and its accessories and reestablish it at the same point as follows:
