

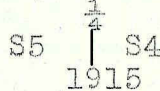
Chains

- 34.50 Enter grove of aspen, bears NW. and SE.
- 39.93 Set a basalt rock 16x12x6 ins., 12 ins. in the ground for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., marked with  $\frac{1}{4}$  on N. face, and raised a mound of stone 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, N. of cor.
- 40.50 Leave aspen grove, bears N. and S.
- 45.40 Enter aspen grove, bears NW. and SE.
- 47.40 Smith Creek, 4 lks. wide, course NW., 1345 ft. below the cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10. Ascend steep slope to the east.
- 48.00 Leave aspen grove.
- 56.80 Rocky mountain spur, slopes N., 290 ft. above creek. Descend W. slope.
- 60.00 Descend over cliffs, bear N. and S.
- 64.40 Bottom of cliffs, bear N. and S., 230 ft. below spur. Continue descent.
- 79.87 315 ft. below bottom of cliffs. The cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9. Land, high, rocky volcanic and quartz conglomerate mountains. Soil, dry, gravelly and rocky, 4th rate. Good growth of sagebrush, considerable grass and other feed. Patches of buckbrush and aspen. Good grazing land.

N.0°03'W. between secs. 4 and 5.

- 4.00 Descend NW. slope of mountains. Small mountain spur, slopes NW., 30 ft. below corner.
- 12.50 Smith creek, 6 lks. wide, course W., 45 ft. below spur. Ascend S. slope.
- 31.50 Ridge, bears E. and W., 155 ft. above creek. Descend NE. slope.
- 40.00 130 ft. below ridge.

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:

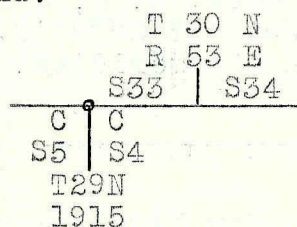


and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, W. of cor.

- 47.00 Small spring, 1 chain W. of line. Asc.
- 49.00 Top of small hill, 25 ft. above spring.
- 51.50 Small stream, 3 lks. wide, course NW. Asc.
- 75.00 Mountain spur, slopes W., 90 ft. above stream. Descend along W. slope.
- 84.75 Head of small creek, 21 lks. wide, course W. 70 ft. below spur. Ascend gradually.
- 89.20 30 ft. above creek.

Intersect the N. Bdy. of the Tp., at West 22.54 chs. from the cor. of secs. 33 and 34.

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the Closing Corner of Secs. 4 and 5, with brass cap mkd:



and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, S. of cor.

High, rolling rocky mountains of volcanic and conglomerate rocks. Slopes to the west. Soil, dry, gravelly and shallow, 4th rate. Good growth sagebrush, fair grass and other feed, good grazing land. No timber. July 12, 1915.
