41.50 Small spur, slopes NW., 35 ft. above draw.  
 47.50 Small ravine, course NW.  
 55.20 Small spur, slopes NW., 50 ft. above ravine. Descend.  
 57.50 Head of draw, course N., 25 ft. below spur.  
 60.20 Small spur, slopes N. Descend E. slope.  
 79.74 215 ft. below spur.

The cor. of secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8.  
 Land, high, rolling mountains of quartz conglomerate rocks with a general N. slope.  
 Soil; dry, rocky and gravelly. Shallow and much washed on the slopes, 3rd and 4th rate. Good growth sagebrush, good feed of grass, weeds and brush. No timber.  
 Good grazing land.

N.0°04'W., between secs. 5 and 6.

Over high, rolling mountains with a slope to the NW.  
 1.00 Wash, course NW., 40 ft. below corner. Ascend SW. slope.  
 9.55 Small mountain spur, slopes NW., 30 ft. above wash. Descend NE. slope.  
 12.00 Ravine, course NW., 25 ft. below spur.  
 18.00 Mountain spur, slopes NW. Descend N. slope.  
 23.40 Smith creek, 6 lks. wide, course NW. Ascend S. slope.  
 27.50 Mountain spur, slopes NW., 30 ft. above creek. Descend N. slope.  
 36.25 Wide draw, course NW., 25 ft. below spur. Ascend.  
 40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:

dig pits 18x18x12 ins. N. and S. of cor. 3 ft. dist., and raise a mound of earth  $3\frac{1}{2}$  ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, W. of cor.

40.30 Ridge, bears NW. and SE., 90 ft. above draw. Descend NE. slope.  
 49.10 Wide draw, course W. Ascend gradually.  
 55.00 Broad flat ridge, bears E. and W., 30 ft. above draw. Descend gentle slope to the N.  
 67.15 Draw, course NW., 55 ft. below ridge. Ascend gently.  
 79.75 Ridge, bears NW. and SE., 25 ft. above draw. Descend gentle NE. slope.  
 82.35 Ravine, course NW., 10 ft. below ridge. Ascend gently.  
 89.13 30 ft. above ravine.

Intersect the N. bdy. of the Tp., at W. 22.56 chs. from the cor. of secs. 32 and 33.

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the Closing Corner of secs. 5 and 6 with brass cap mkd:

Land, high, rolling mountains of volcanic and quartz conglomerate rocks with a general NW. and westerly slope.

Soil, dry, gravelly and rocky, shallow and much washed on the slopes, 3rd and 4th rate. Too rough, rocky and dry for cultivation.  
 Good feed of sagebrush, grass, weeds and other herbage. Willows and scattering aspen along Smith Creek.  
 Good grazing land. July 14, 1915.
