GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

This fractional township consists of rolling mountains mostly of volcanic rock, but there are some outcrops of limestone and hardened sandstone, more especially in the NW.¼ of Sec.6.

There are a good many outcrops of rock in place, and much loose rock scattered over the surface.

The soil is very dry, coarse texture, gravelly and rocky, washed on the slopes, shallow and unfit for cultivation.

There is fair feed for grazing purposes, consisting of some grass, and weeds and medium sized sagebrush. There are some willows and quaking aspen along the streams, especially along dixie creek.

It is well watered for grazing purposes, there being several small streams with running water. The only land suitable for cultivation is small patches along Dixie Creek and this would have to be irrigated. There is no land in cultivation;and there are no settlers in the fractional township, nor none in the immediate vicinity that I am aware of.
