Chains

on the lat. arc,  $5^{\circ}36'S$ . on the decl. arc and determine a meridian with the solar.

Thence N. on a random line on the E. Bdy. of the Tp., setting temporary  $\frac{1}{4}$  and sec. cors. at intervals of 40.00 chs.

160.00 Set a temporary cor. for Tps. 34 and 35 N., R. 56 E.

From the cor. of Tps. 34 and 35 N., R. 56 E., South on the E. Bdy. of the Tp., east of sec. 1. Over rolling land of flat ridges and shallow ravines, with a general SE. slope.

40.00 120 ft. below corner.

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. for sec. 1, with brass cap mkd:

dig pits 18x18x12 ins. N. and S. of cor. 3 ft. dist., and raise a mound of earth  $3\frac{1}{2}$  ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, W. of cor.

48.47 Ravine, course SE., 40 ft. below corner.

Thence over fairly level land.

80.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the cor. of secs. 1 and 12, with brass cap mkd:

dig pits 24x24x12 ins. in each section 6 ft. dist., and raise a mound of earth 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.

Land, somewhat rolling or undulating, with a general SE. slope away from the foot of mountains.

Soil, very dry, medium texture, sandy and gravelly loam from 1 to 2 ft. in depth, 1st and 2nd rate. Could be cultivated if it were not so dry. Good growth sagebrush, considerable grass, weeds and other feed. No timber. Good grazing land.

South on the E. Bdy. of the Tp., east of sec. 12. Over gently rolling or undulating land.
