

## Chains

- From the temp. cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16, set Sept. 25, 1915, I retrace East between secs. 10 and 15.  
40.00 I search diligently but find no  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.
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- From the cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10, I retrace East between secs. 3 and 10.  
40.13 The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., falls 61 lks. S. of line.  
It is a willow stake 2 ins. diam. by 12 ins. long, lying on the ground on an old mound of earth, squared at the top and marked  $\frac{1}{4}$ .  
The course of this half mile is S.89°08'E. and the length 40.13 chs.
- From the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., I retrace East.  
40.17 I find the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11, falling 14 lks. S. of line. It is a willow stake 2 ins. in diam., by 12 ins. long, lying on the ground on an old mound of earth, squared at the top, but the markings are illegible.  
The course of this half mile is S.89°48'E.
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- From the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11, I retrace N. between secs. 2 and 3.  
39.81 I find the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. falling 64 lks. E. of line.  
It is a willow stake 2 ins. diam. by 18 ins. long, lying on the ground on an old mound of earth, squared at the top and marked  $\frac{1}{4}$ .  
The length of this line is 39.82 chs.
- 78.24 I find the old cor. of secs. 2 and 3, on the 7th Std. Par. N., falling 1.25 chs. E. of line.  
It is a willow stake 2 ins. diam. by 20 ins. long, lying on the ground on an old mound of earth. It is squared at the top, but the markings are illegible because of weathering.  
The course of this mile is N.0°55'E., and the length 78.25 chs.
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- From the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11, I retrace East between secs. 2 and 11.  
40.57 I find the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., falling 1.03 chs. S. of line.  
It is a willow stake 2 ins. in dia., by 18 ins. long, lying on the ground on an old mound of earth, squared at the top and marked  $\frac{1}{4}$ .  
The course of this half mile is S.88°33'E., and the length 40.58 chs.
- 41.15 From the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. I retrace East.  
I find the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12, falling 40 lks. S. of line. It is a willow stake 2 ins. diam. by 18 ins. long, set in a mound of stone, squared at the top but the markings are illegible because of weathering.  
The course of this half mile is S.89°27'E., and the length 41.15 chs.
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- From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12, I retrace North between secs. 1 and 2.  
40.00 I search diligently but find no  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.  
79.59 I find the cor. of secs. 1 and 2, falling 2.03 chs. E. of line, on the 7th Std. Par. N.  
It is the remains of a willow stake, lying on an old mound of earth.  
The course of this mile is N.1°28'E. and the length 79.62 chs.
