GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

Of the previously unsurveyed portions of this township the southeastern portion is high mountains, flanked by lower rolling mountains. They are made up mostly of Quartz pebble conglomerate rocks, with a hardened sandstone or quartzite matrix. In some places, eruptive rocks have broken through in the form of dikes, but the mountains are largely of a sedimentary formation. Parts of it have been located at different times as oil bearing placers.

The northwestern portion is low rolling mountains or hills with a general SE. slope. They also, are a sedimentary formation, largely the same quartz conglomerate with some outcrops of volcanic rocks.

Both of these previously unsurveyed portions have very good feed for grazing, consisting of a good growth of sagebrush, considerable grass, weeds and other forage. However, it is not very well watered. There is no timber, no land in cultivation, and no settlers in these fraction-
