

## Dependent Resurvey of the E. Boundary of T. 32 N., R. 59 E. 3.

N., Rs. 59 and 60 E., which is a granite stone 10x8x4 ins. above ground, firmly set, and marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

S. on retracement on the E. bdys. of Tps. 32 and 33 N., R. 59 E.

After searching diligently at intervals of 40.00 and 80.00 chs., I am unable to find any evidence of cors., until at

398.89 fall 9 lks. W. of the old cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30 which is a decayed stake 3 ins. square, 12 ins. above ground, loosely set, marks almost invisible and no signs of pits. Therefore the course of the line bet, this cor. and the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, T. 33 N., Rs. 59 and 60 E. is S.0°01'E., and the distance is 398.89 chs.; and by proportionate measurement the length of each half mile is 39.89 chs.

## Dependent Resurvey of the E. Boundary of T. 32 N., R. 59 E.

At the old cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30, heretofore described, I set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground beside the old stake for cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30, with brass cap mkd:

and dig pits, 18x18x12 ins., in each sec., 5½ ft. dist. N.0°01'W. on a resurvey bet. secs. 19 and 24.

39.89 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 26 ins. in the ground for ¼ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:
