15.00 Spring branch, 60 ft. below spur, 10 lks. wide, 4 ins. deep, course SE.; asc.

39.00 Point of spur, 330 ft. above spring branch, projects SW.; desc.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. dia., 26 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.

62.50 Top of high, rough, rocky spur, 730 ft. above spring branch, bears NW. and SE.; desc.

80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. dia., 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, with brass cap mkd.
