October 4, 1915:

- 1.40 N.0°14'E. on the E. Bdy. of sec. 12. Over mountainous land. Top of high ridge, 20 ft. above section corner, bears N.30°E. and S.30°W.
- 40.06 Proportional distance. Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 12, with brass cap mkd:

- and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, W. of cor. Corner is 350 ft. below ridge.
- 40.70 Bottom of draw, 5 ft. below  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., course S.80°W.
- 55.65 Top of spur, 85 ft. above draw, projects S.40°W. Continue ascent.
- 68.40 Draw, 110 ft. above spur, course S.30°W.
- 80.13 Proportional distance. 175 ft. above draw. Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the cor. of secs. 1 and 12, with brass cap mkd:

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, W. of cor.  
Land, mountainous.  
Many solid rocky outcrops on ridge at south end of mile. Remainder of mile, soil is rich yellow clay loam with many loose rocks about 26 ins. deep on gravel and stony subsoil. Medium dry and very hard. Rocks are granite and quartzite.  
No timber. Heavy sagebrush, buck brush, service berry and chaparral. A little grass.

- N.0°14'E. along the E. Bdy. of sec. 1. Over rough mountainous land, ascending.
- 2.10 Top of ridge, 70 ft. above section corner, bears SW. and NE.
- 11.00 Dry wash, 10 lks. wide, 6 ins. deep, in bottom of draw, 90 ft. below ridge, course SW. This is the head of Secret Creek.
- 40.06 Proportional distance. Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. for sec. 1, with brass cap mkd:

- and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, W. of cor. Corner is 425 ft. above draw.
- 80.12 The cor. of Ts. 34 and 35 N., Rs. 60 and 61 E. Corner is 640 ft. above  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.  
A small spring bears west about 4 chs.  
Land mountainous.  
Soil is medium, dry, hard, yellow sand and clay, about 26 ins. deep on gravel and stony subsoil. Surface soil is also stony. No timber. Undergrowth, sagebrush, service berry, chaparral and choke cherry. A little grass. Oct. 4, 1915.
