Chains

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, W. of cor.

Land rolling.

Soil is a mixture of clay, sand and gravel of about equal parts; medium, dry and fairly loose. Subsoil is the same. Many stones of granite and quartzite.

No timber.

Undergrowth of sage, service berry and buck brush. A little grass.

N.4°47'E. on a resurvey between secs. 1 and 2. Proportional distance.

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for the ¼ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:

Sept. 15, 1915:

At the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12, I set off 40° 52'N. on the lat. arc; 3°19'N. on the decl. arc, and at 8 h 0 m, a.m., l.m.t., determine a meridian with the solar.

Thence West on a resurvey between secs. 2 and 11.

Point for 1/16 sec. cor.

Thence West on a survey.

21.25

Barb wire fence bears N. and S. 5 lks. N. to cor. of fence, where fence bears E. and W.

40.00

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for the ¼ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:

From which:

An aspen 5 ins. in dia. bears S.15°30'E., 132 lks. dist., marked ¼S 11 BT.

An aspen 5 ins. in dia. bears N.70°30'W. 36 lks. dist., marked ¼S2BT.

Corner is 295 ft. above ravine.

Barb wire fence bears N. and S., 10 lks. N. to corner of fence, from which fence extends E.

Top of rocky spur, 460 ft. above ¼ sec. cor., projects S.30°E.

Draw, with same elevation as spur, course S.30°E.

Top of spur, 225 ft. above draw, projects S.30°E.

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 16 ins. in the ground to bed rock and in a mound of stone for the cor. of secs. 2 and 11, with brass cap mkd:
