

Chains

- mahogany timber.
- 8.75 Draw, 100 ft. above section corner, course SE.
- 20.00 Ledge of rock, extending N. and S., 30 ft. high.
Ascend over same.
- 29.25 Top of ridge, 635 ft. above draw, bears N.65°E. and S.65°W.
Descend through scattering mountain mahogany and balsam timber and patches of dense aspen.
- 40.15 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:

$$\begin{array}{c} S \quad 3 \\ \frac{1}{4} S \quad 10 \end{array} \checkmark$$

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, N. of cor. This corner is 70 ft. below ridge.
- 65.65 Small spring flowing stream of water North.
- 66.80 Creek, 1 lk. wide, 1 in. deep, 65 ft. below $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., course N.20°E. Ascend through dense aspen timber.
- 79.90 Spring on line, now nearly dry. No stream flowing from the same.
- 80.30 The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10, 340 ft. above creek.
At this corner I set off $1^{\circ}18\frac{1}{2}'$ N. on the decl. arc, and observe the sun on the meridian at apparent noon, the resulting latitude is $40^{\circ}52'$ N.
Land mountainous.
Soil is all very rocky with many solid outcrops. Rich, brown, moist, fine, loose sandy loam with a little gravel among rocks. From a few inches to several feet deep. Timber, mountain mahogany, fir and chaparral. Undergrowth, chaparral, willows, choke cherry and sage brush. Good growth of grass.
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- 4.80 N.0°01'W. on a true line between secs. 3 and 4.
Over rough mountainous land, through dense timber.
Head of draw, 70 ft. below section corner, course NE.
Leave timber, bears with draw.
Ascend through dense chaparral.
- 13.60 Top of rocky spur, 90 ft. above draw, projects N.75°E.
Descend over vertical cliffs 120 ft. high.
- 17.30 Bottom of draw, 215 ft. below spur, course E.
Ascend through scattering mountain mahogany timber.
- 38.80 Top of rocky ridge, 345 ft. above draw, bears N.60°E. and S.60°W.
- 40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 18 ins. in the ground to bed rock and in a mound of stone, for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:

$$\begin{array}{c} S4 \quad \frac{1}{4} \quad S3 \\ 1915 \end{array} \checkmark$$

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor. Corner is set 35 ft. below ridge.
Descend steep N. slope, through scattering mountain mahogany timber.
- 60.00 Enter dense aspen timber and willow undergrowth, bears NE. and SW.
- 60.55 Creek, 1 lk. wide, 2 ins. deep, 695 ft. below $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., course N.65°E.
Ascend through scattering aspen and mountain mahogany timber, and very dense chaparral.
- 64.90 Top of low ridge, 100 ft. above creek, bears N.65°E. and S.65°W.
- 74.50 Creek, 1 lk. wide, 1 in. deep, 230 ft. below ridge, course N.65°E.
- 84.14 Intersect the N. Bdy. of the Tp., 30 ft. above creek, and S.89°49'W., 7.05 chs. from the cor. of secs. 33 and 34, T.35 N., R. 61 E. At point of intersection
