

Chains

October 2, 1915:

N.0°02'W. on a true line between secs. 5 and 6.

Ascending over mountainous land, over broken E. slope of west side of Pole Canyon.

37.40 Top of spur, 470 ft. above section corner, projects SE.

Enter dense timber, bears with spur.

40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:

from which:

An aspen 4 ins. in dia., bears N.26°30'E. 63 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S5BT.

An aspen 4 ins. in dia. bears N.10°W. 69 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S6BT. Corner is set 10 ft. below spur.

47.15 Bottom of draw, 35 ft. below $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., course SE.

Leave timber, bears with draw.

60.85 Top of spur, 180 ft. above draw, projects SE. Descend through dense timber.

65.70 Branch of Pole Creek, 3 lks. wide, 2 ins. deep, 85 ft. below spur, course SE. Leave timber, bears with creek.

83.00 Top of ridge, 335 ft. above creek, projects SE.

83.61 Intersect the N. Bdy. of the Tp., at a point 6.81 chs. S.89°49'W. of the cor. of secs. 31 and 32, T.35 N., R. 61 E.

At the point of intersection, I set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the closing corner of secs. 5 and 6, with brass cap mkd:

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, S. of cor.

Land, mountainous.

South end of mile, very few rocks, fine, yellow, loose, rich, sandy loam with a little gravel. A very few rocks.

North of $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., soil becomes more rocky with many large granite boulders and a few outcrops. Very rocky at closing corner.

Timber, aspen.

Undergrowth, chaparral, willows, choke cherry, service berry, sage and buck brush. Good growth of grass.

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
