## GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

Practically all of the four west ranges of sections of this fractional township may be classed as rough, mountainous, the remaining range being rolling foothills. The soil is mostly made up of decomposed rock, granite predominating, and contains much mica. There is usually a little loam on the surface, while in the bottoms of draws and along creeks the soil is rich, black loam. There is also considerable rich, black loam on the rocks on the higher ridges. However, there is very little soil on the higher ridges, solid rock being exposed in most places. This rock takes the form of cliffs in great many places, some of the cliffs being 500 to 600 ft. high. The only cultivated land in the fraction is in Section 2, where it is rolling and the soil is quite rich, though very stony. The land is irrigated. In the mountains, wherever there is any soil, rich, nutritious grasses grow in abundance. The surface, however, is too rough for any animal except the goat to graze over. The draws and along creeks in the rolling part of the township have abundant growth of grass also.
