

Retracement of Subdivisional Lines in T.36 N., R.61 E. 19.

Chains

June 18, 1915:

At 9 h 0 m, a.m., l.m.t., at the cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30, I set off $41^{\circ}00'N.$ on the lat. arc; $23^{\circ}24\frac{1}{2}'N.$ on the decl. arc, and determine a meridian with the solar. Thence West retracing between secs. 24 and 25.

40.13 After diligent search, I find no evidence of the old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

82.77 Old sec. cor. of secs. 23, 24, 25 and 26, bears N. 34 lks. dist. It is a badly decayed post, with faint scribe marks lying alongside of fence corner and old mound of stone. Course of mile $N.89^{\circ}46'W.$

South on a retracement between secs. 25 and 26.

40.00 No evidence of old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

80.00 No evidence of old sec. cor.

Continue same line South between secs. 35 and 36.

39.89 Old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bears E. 49 lks. dist. It is a granite stone $36 \times 15 \times 12$ ins., lying in an old mound of stone, and marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on one face.

The course of the last $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles is $S.0^{\circ}14'E.$, and the proportional length $39.96 \frac{1}{3}$ chs.

I continue same line South.

80.04 Or 40.15 chs. from the old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., - old Std. Cor. for secs. 35 and 36 bears East 81 lks. dist. Old corner heretofore described.

Course of the last half mile $S.0^{\circ}27'E.$
