


Chains

- W. of cor.
- 55.50 Head of draw, 255 ft. below spur, course S.80°E.
- 57.30 Old road, bears E. and W. On top of main divide, same elevation as draw.
- 61.80 Ravine, with creek from Angel Lake (creek now dry), 100 ft. below divide, course N.65°E.
- 70.90 Spur, 100 ft. above ravine, projects N.70°E.
- 85.80 Draw, 112 ft. below spur, course E.
- 91.86 30 ft. above draw. Intersect the N. Bdy. of the Tp., 15.24 chs. N.89°55'W. from the cor. of secs. 34 and 35, T.37 N., R. 61 E.

At point of intersection, set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the Closing Corner of secs. 2 and 3, with brass cap mkd:




and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, S. of cor.

Land, mountainous.
 Soil is sand and gravel, hard and dry. Very stony. Many huge boulders and solid outcrops of granite and quartzite. Some loam in draws. A good deal of grass. Patches of dense aspen, willows, and chaparral.
 August 2, 1915.


June 30, 1915:
 East on a true line between secs. 14 and 23. Slight descent thru sagebrush and good grass. Scattering patches of aspen.

- 2.20 Creek, 2 lks. wide, 2 ins. deep, course S.80°E.
- 24.00 Creek, 5 lks. wide, 3 ins. deep, 165 ft. below sec. cor. course N.30°E. Narrow strip of aspen along creek. Ascend over spur of hill of solid, burnt, red granite.
- 33.10 Top of spur, 70 ft. above creek, bears N.
- 40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for the ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 14, with brass cap mkd:



and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, N. of cor.

- 48.20 Same creek, 5 lks. wide, 3 ins. deep, 200 ft. below spur, course S.80°E. Strip of dense aspen about 50 lks. wide along creek.
- 80.00 75 ft. below creek.
 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the cor. of secs. 13 and 14, with brass cap mkd:



and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, N. of cor.

At this cor., I set off 41°00½'N. on the lat. arc; and observe the sun on the meridian at 12 h 03m, p.m., l.m.t., the resulting decl. is 23°13'N.

Land, rolling.
 Soil at spur is mostly solid rock. Red burnt granite. Remainder of mile is sandy and clay loam with granite and quartzite gravel and boulders. Moist near creek; remainder dry. Good growth of grass. Sage and service berry brush. Patches of dense aspen.
