

Chains

30.70 Old road, bears SE. and NW.

44.62 Old cor. for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. 13.

Alongside of old corner, I set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. for sec. 13, with brass cap mkd:

dig pits 18x18x12 ins. N. and S. of cor. 3 ft. dist., and raise a mound of earth $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor.

Thence N. $0^{\circ}10'E$.

48.90 Draw, course N. $30^{\circ}W$.

51.60 Road leading to Cedar Pass, bears E. and W.

64.90 Draw, course N. $30^{\circ}W$.

84.90 Old cor. of secs. 12 and 13, heretofore described.

At point where found, alongside of old post, Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the cor. of secs. 12 and 13, with brass cap mkd:

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor.

Corner is set 45 ft. below angle point.

Land, rolling.

Soil, clay and sand with a little gravel. Several feet deep. Medium, friable and dry. A few boulders. Heavy sagebrush. A little grass.

No timber, except at extreme south end of mile, where for 4 chs. there is dense, heavy pinon pine and cedar.

RETRACEMENT OF W. BDY. T.37 N., R. 62 E.

May 19, 1915:

At 9 h 0 m, a.m., l.m.t., at the old cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, on the W. Bdy. of the Tp., which is a badly decayed post 2x2x24 ins. lying on an old mound of earth, and marked with faint scribe marks and 5 notches on one edge and 1 notch on opposite edge, I set off $41^{\circ}07'N$. on the lat. arc; $19^{\circ}39'N$. on the decl. arc, and determine a meridian with the solar.

Thence South on a retracement between secs. 7 and 12.

40.30 Intersect the old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 7 and 12.

It is a badly decayed cedar stake 1x1x24 ins. above ground, still standing in an old mound of earth, and marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face.

78.40 Old cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13 and 18, bears East 34 lks.

dist. It is a granite stone 8x8x12 ins. above ground, marked with 4 notches on S. and 2 notches on N. edge, and a mound of stone to the west. The old corner is in good condition.

The course of the last half mile is S. $0^{\circ}31'E$, and the length 38.10 chs.

Continue same line South between secs. 13 and 18. The old $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of secs. 13 and 18, bears East 41 lks. dist. It is a granite stone 6x8x6 ins. above ground, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

Course of this half mile S. $0^{\circ}06'E$.
