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Aug. 19; From the cor. of secs. 31 & 32, on the south boundary of T.30N., ^{R.40 E.} which is an iron post herein² after described, I retrace,

West between secs. 6 & 31.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cpr. After diligent search I am unable to find any traces of the old $\frac{1}{4}$ cor.

I continue my retracement along same line.

78.77 Intersect N. & S. line 3 lks. S. of the old cor. of Tps. 29 & 30 N., R's. 39 & 40 E. which is a porphyry stone 12-12-8 ins. above ground, mkd. and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

I build a new corner at the same point as follows;

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground for the cor. of Tps. 29 & 30 N., R's. 39 & 40 E. with brass cap mkd.;
