Over rolling valley land gradually ascend 57 ft. to the dec. cor.

Intersect the old \( \frac{1}{4}\) cor. of secs. 2 & 35, which is a stake 2-2-30 ins.long, mkd. \( \frac{1}{4}\) S., lying alongside traces of pitsand mound of earth. I reestablish the cor. at the center center of the mound of earth as follows;

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 24 ins. in the Ground for the \( \frac{1}{4}\) cor. of secs. 2 & 35, with brass cap mkd.;

At this point I make diligent search for the old sec. cor., which I am unable to find, and as there are no subdivisions depending upon this cor., I reestablish it as follows; Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for the cor. of secs. 2,3,34 & 35, with brass cap mkd.;
