

Chains Boundary surveyed by A.T.Harris.

Aug. 14, 1914; I run west from the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, latitude 40° 20' N., Longitude 117° 25' W., hereinafter described, retracing and presurveying the

east 1/2 mile of sec. 35 as follows:

Over rolling valley land gradually ascend 57 ft. to the 1/4 sec. cor.

40.00 Intersect the old 1/4 cor. of secs. 2 & 35, which is a stake 2-2-30 ins. long, mkd. 1/4 S., lying alongside traces of pits and mound of earth. I reestablish the cor. at the center center of the mound of earth as follows;

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 24 ins. in the Ground for the 1/4 cor. of secs. 2 & 35, with brass cap mkd.;

and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high, N. of cor.

The course of this 1/2 mile is west. I continue my retracement west along same line, gradually ascend 142 ft. to the sec. cor.

80.00 At this point I make diligent search for the old sec. cor., which I am unable to find, and as there are no subdivisions depending upon this cor., I reestablish it as follows;

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 & 35, with brass cap mkd.;

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high, W. of cor.

Land, east slope valley.

Soil, gravelly and rocky: 3d. rate.
Undergrowth, sage and rabbit brush, bunch grass.
