

## Subdivisions of T. 29 N., R. 40 E

Chains Surveyed by A.T.Harris.

Aug. 17, 1914: At 8h. 15 m ,a.m.,l.m.t., I set off  $40^{\circ}$   $20'$  N. on the lat. arc;  $13^{\circ} 35'$  N. on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34, and 35, on the south boundary of the township.

Thence I run

N.  $00^{\circ} 7'$  W. bet, secs. 34 and 35.

Overeast slope valley land, descend 29 ft.

6.30 Cross draw, course N.  $45^{\circ}$  E.; ascend 43 ft. to low spur.13.40 Wagon road, bears N.  $45^{\circ}$  E and S.  $45^{\circ}$  W.24.90 Top of low spur, bears N.  $50^{\circ}$  E. and S.  $50^{\circ}$  W.; descend gradually 20 ft. to the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the ground for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  cor. of secs. 34 and 35, with brass cap mkd.;

and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft, base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, W. of cor.60.00 Cross wash, 20 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, course N.  $75^{\circ}$  E.

80.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins, diam., 24 ins. in the ground for the cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34, and 35, with brass cap mkd.;
