

Subdivisions of T. 30 N., R. 40 E.

Chains Surveyed by A.T.Harris.

Sept. 4, 1914: At 8h. 5m., a.m., l.m.t., I set off $40^{\circ} 25'$ N. on the lat. arc; $7^{\circ} 22'$ N. on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of secs. 35 and 36, on the south boundary of the township.

Thence I run

N. $00^{\circ} 4'$ E. bet. secs. 35 and 36.

Over valley land, sloping east, gradually ascend 60 ft. to the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

24.60 Bottom of wash, 20 lks. wide, 16 ins. deep, course S. 50° E.38.00 Cross wash, 20 lks. wide, 10 ins. deep, course S. 80° E.

40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the ground for the $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of secs. 35 and 36, with brass cap mkd.;

and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor.

Gradually descend 6 ft.

55.80 Wagon road, bears N. 80° W. and S. 80° E.

59.50 Wash, 25 lks. wide, 10 ins. deep, 6 ft. below the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., course S. 70° E.; ascend gradually 15 ft. to the sec. cor.

80.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground for the cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36, with brass cap mkd.;

No timber.
