W. of cor.

Land, rolling.

Soil, light rocky clay loam, shale lime rock.

Undergrowth, sagebrush and bunch grass.

No timber.

Land suitable for grazing only.


Survey of a portion of the west boundary of T. 31 N., R. 40 E.

Oct. 5, 1914: At 8h. 15m., a.m., l.m.t., I set off 40° 33' N. on the lat. arc; 4° 32' S. on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13 and 18, the

Thence I run

North on a random line, setting temp. points at intervals of 40.00 chs., and at 161.35 chs. intersect E. and W. line 5 lks. E. of the old cor. of Tps. 31 and 32 N., Rs. 39 and 40 E., which is a cedar post, 2 x 2 x 36 ins. long, set 10 ins. in the ground, mkd. and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General. I reestablish the cor. at the same point as follows:

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground for the cor. of Tps. 31 and 32 N., Rs. 39 and 40 E., with brass cap mkd.:



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and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, S. of cor.

The falling answers to a correction of 0° 01', or 2½ lks.
