- 41.21 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia. 26 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 17, with brass cap mkd.

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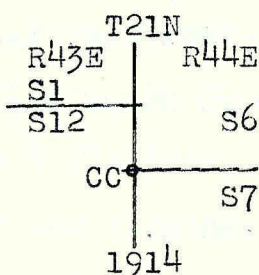

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia. 24 ins. in the ground for the closing cor. of secs. 6 and 7, with brass cap marked



and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, east of cor.

Thence I run
