GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

Extending diagonally across this township from northeast to southwest in a broken line is the divide between Wall Creek and Little High Rock. Creek. The height of the divide varies greatly in the different parts, though it may roughly be said to be highest at the corners of the township and lowest near the middle. The western and the northwestern portions of the township comprise the upper end of the Wall Creek basin. This consists of gently rolling land draining to the west. The southeastern part of the township is rather low and drains to the eastward.

The soil of the rougher portions is all very rocky, as is also that of much of the rolling portions. There are however some extensive tracts in the Wall Creek basin and some smaller tracts along the creeks in the southeastern part with a very fertile sandy loam soil.

The east central part of the township has many patches of bad-land soil almost bare of vegetation, but in all of the remainder of the township, even where it is very rocky, there is a fair to good growth of sage brush and of bunch grass. This condition coupled with the presence of water in many places makes the township well adapted to grazing. The only timber in the township is in the southwestern part, where there are a few scattering mountain mahoganies.

The only settler in the township is Mr. C.J.Lyons, who has ashack and some other improvements in sections 26 and 35.
