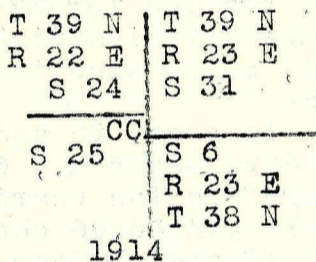


Resurvey of Subdivision Lines, T. 39 N., R. 23 E. 13.

- Chains
 130.35 Rocky gorge, course N. 15°W.; ascend 50 ft. on NE. slope to top of ridge.
 138.45 Ridge, bears N. and S.; descend 105 ft. on NW. slope to wash.
 150.15 Wash, 45 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, in the bottom of a ravine course N. 15°W. ascend 85 ft. on NE. slope to top of ridge.
 162.15 Dim road, Owens ranch to Gerlach, bears N. and S.
 169.00 Ridge, bears N. and S., descend 5 ft. on SW. slope to new closing corner.
 174.14 The old CC of Ts. 38 and 39 N., R. 23 E., which I find to be a stone, 13x7x6 ins., standing in a small depression in the ground, marked 39 N on NE., 23 E on SE., 38 N on SW. and 22 E on NW face, with 6 notches on N., E. and W. edges, with a mound of stone 24 ins. base, 18 ins. high, S. of cor. As this C. C. is not on the line between the nearest two corners of the boundary which this boundary intersects, I change it to a line point by destroying the mound, effacing the markings on the stone, marking the stone LP on E. face and setting it 9 ins. in the ground.
 174.28 Intersect the E. bdy. of T. 39 N., R. 22 E., at a point N. 1° 42'W., 5.38 chs., from the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. on the E. bdy. of sec. 25, and at point of intersection, set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for C. C. of Ts. 38 and 39 N., R. 23 E., with brass cap mkd.

 This line is on the west side of a high mountain. The soil is gravelly and rocky and unfit for cultivation. There is a sparse growth of sagebrush and some grass. No timber.

- November 4: From the cor. of secs. 35 and 36 on the S. bdy. of the Tp., hereinbefore described, I retrace North, bet. secs. 35 and 36.
 40.00 After diligent search find no trace of $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
 79.43 Fall 18.25 chs. W. of the cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36, hereinafter described.
 Therefore the bearing of the line is N. 12° 56' E., and the length 81.50 chs.

November 4, 1914.

- November 6: From the cor. of secs. 35 and 36 on the S. bdy. of the Tp., I run
 N. 12° 56' E., on W. bdy. of sec. 36.
 Over mountainous land draining E.
 40.75 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., referring to sec. 36, with brass cap mkd.
