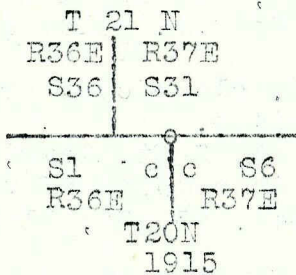


West Boundary of T. 20 N., R. 36 East.

Chains

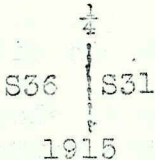
at 56 chs.
Intersect the 4th Standard Parallel N., at a point 11.65 chs. E. of the cor. of T. 21 N., Rs. 36 and 37 E., which is a granite stone, 30x10x9 ins. loosely set in a small mound of stone, marked with 6 notches on N., S., E. and W. edges. Reset stone 20 ins. in the ground, and build a mound of stone 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high N. of cor.
At point of intersection, set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. dia., 12 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone with 5 ft. base, for closing corner of T. 20 N., Rs. 36 and 37 E., with brass cap mkd.,

A pinon pine, 10 ins. in diam., bears S. 18 3/4° E., 51 lks. dist., mkd. CC T20N R37E S6 BT
A pinon pine, 16 ins. in dia., bears S. 10 1/2° W., 173 lks. dist., mkd. C C T20N R36E S1 BT
Land, mountainous, exposure and drainage to the NW.
Soil, rocky and gravelly, mixed with some find, rich, moist mountain loam; volcanic and granite formations; 3rd and 4th rates.
Timber, very scattering pinon pine on mile.
Undergrowth, heavy sage brush and grass. Grazing land.

WEST BOUNDARY OF T. 20 N., R. 36 EAST

Oct. 28: At 8h 44m a.m., l.m.t., I set off: 39° 32' N. on the lat. arc; 12° 53' S. on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian at the cor. of Ts. 19 and 20 N., Rs. 35 and 36 E., as set by me, heretofore described.
Thence
North, bet. secs. 31 and 36, on Range line.
Over high, rough mountainous land, facing to the SW., through scattering pinon pine timber.
2.90 Head of draw 5 ft. below cor., course SW., ascend S. slope, 165 ft.
8.70 Rocky spur, projects W.; descend NE. slope, 235 ft.
13.85 Near head of draw, course N. 85° W.; ascend SW. slope, 45 ft.
18.10 Near head of draw, course W., ascend SW. slope, 105 ft.
22.75 Spur, projects W.; descend 85 ft.
27.40 Near head of canyon, course W. for 5 chs., thence SW. Ascend steep SW. slope, 205 ft.
39.30 Main high ridge, bears N. 70° W., 3 chs. to rocky point, and SE.
Descend NE. slope, 25 ft.
40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for 1/4 sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.,
