42.45 Spur, projects W.; leave ledges and slide rock, and all but few scattering pinon timber, bears E. and W.

56.00 Draw, 245 ft. below spur, course N. 80° W.; ascend SW. slope, 105 ft.

62.00 Spur, projects N. 70° W.; descend 65 ft.

63.60 Draw, course N. 80° W. for 3 chs., thence NW.; ascend SW. slope over small ledges, 40 ft. and 05.02

69.00 Spur, projects N. 60° W.; descend N. slope, 215 ft.

74.60 Canyon, course N. 80° W.; ascend steep, nearly S. slope, over nearly solid bed rock, white limestone formation; 250 ft. to

81.90 Intersect the 4th Standard Parallel N., at a point S. $89^{\circ}45'E.$, 9.85 chs., from the standard cor. of secs. 35 and 36, T. 21 N., R. 36 E., which is a conglomerate stone 8x8x12 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked with 5 notches on E. and 1 notch on W. edge, surrounded by few stones. I rebuild a mound of stone to North of cor.

At point of intersection, set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 12 ins. in the ground to solid bed rock, and in a mound of stone, for closing cor. of secs. 1 and 2, with brass cap mkd.,

A Pinon Pine, 11 ins. in diam., bears West, 17 lks. dist. mkd., CC T20N R36E S2 BT

Land, rough, broken mountains, general face and drainage to the NW.

Soil, rocky of granite, limestone and porphyry formations mixed with some light sandy loam; 4th rate.

Undergrowth, sage brush and willows and rose brush, along canyon at 18 chs.; timber, scattering pinon pine on mile.

Land, too rough for grazing land.

Oct. 16, 1915.

Oct. 6: At 8h 48m a.m., l.m.t., I set off $39^{\circ}32'$ on the lat. arc; $4^{\circ}52'S.$ on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian at the cor. of secs. 34 and 35 on S. bdy. of tp., heretofore described.

Thence

N. $0^{\circ}1'W.$, bet. secs. 34 and 35.

Over high mountainous land, through heavy sage brush.
