GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

This township contains chiefly high, rough mountainous lands, lying wholly within the Clan Alpine Range, having a north easterly and southerly trend; ranging in elevation, from approximately 5000 ft. in the NW. corner, which is near base to approximately 10,000 ft. on the S. bdy.; the SE. portion drains in a south easterly direction into Edwards Valley, and the remainder drains W. and NW. into Dixie Valley.

The township is watered by numerous small streams and springs; the largest being Cherry Creek, which rises in the south central part, and flows in an easterly direction, through a deep canyon. The water rises and sinks in several places. Considerable scrub timber of pinon pine and scattering cedars is found throughout the tp. The soil is principally rocky and gravelly, mixed with gravelly and dark, moist, rich mountain loams; from 4th to 2nd rates, of volcanic, porphyry and granite formations; is covered with a heavy growth of black sage brush and nutritious grasses.

The township is well adapted for grazing, for which purpose it is being used.

William E. Davis, living in sec. 21, is the only settler living in the tp. Improvements consists of stone house, corrals and fences. In secs. 21, 22, 27 and 28, there is approximately  $6\frac{1}{2}$  miles of wire fences, the field enclosed is used as a pasture.

Indications of mineral have been found, in the southern part of the tp.
