

Subdivision of T.11 N., R.60 E.

Chains

December 13: At this cor., I set off 23° 07'S., on the decl. arc; and at 11^h 54^m 1.m.t., observe the sun on the meridian; the resulting latitude is 38° 50'.

N.0° 01'E., bet. secs. 4 and 5.

Over rolling hilly land through scattering growth of cedars and pinon pine and medium undergrowth of black sage, yellow top, mountain rush, juniper and scattering grass. Ascend gently.

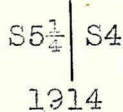
5.00 Top of spur, 15 ft. above sec. cor., projects NW. about 6 chs.

Descend.

11.50 Foot of spur, 70 ft. below the top, brs. N.60°E. and S. 60°W.

Descend gently over rolling land.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for 1/4 sec. cor., with brass cap marked

A cedar, 8 ins. dia., bears S.71° 40'E., 1.32 chs. dist., marked 1/4 S 4 B T.

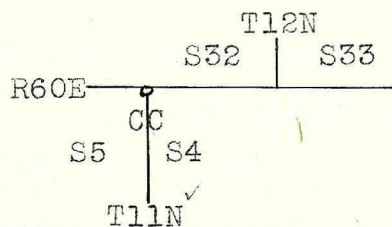
A cedar, 9 ins. dia., bears S.50° 10'W., 51 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S 5 B T.

70 ft. below foot of spur.

59.40 Wagon road, Tonopah to Ely, brs. NE. and SW.

78.87 Intersect N. bdy. of the Tp., 5.34 chs. N. 89° 17' W. of the cor. of secs. 32 and 33, heretofore described.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for closing cor. of secs. 4 and 5, with brass cap marked
