

## Subdivision of T.11 N., R.60 E.

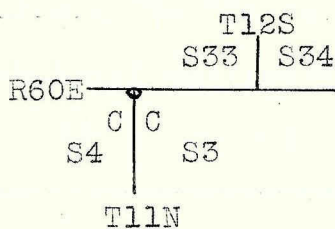
Chains

Descend gently.

64.50 Timber becomes scattering, brs. NE. and SW.

79.30 Intersect N. bdy. of the Tp., 5.44 chs. S.  $89^{\circ}22'W$ . of the cor. of secs. 33 and 34 heretofore described.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for closing cor. of secs. 3 and 4, with brass cap marked



1914 from which

A cedar, 10 ins. dia., bears  $S.32^{\circ}10'E.$ , 24 lks. dist., marked T 11 N R 60 E S 3 B T.

A cedar, 8 ins. dia., bears  $S.71^{\circ}30'W.$ , 66 lks. dist., marked T 11 N R 60 E S 4 B T.

10 ft. below top of spur.

Land, low rolling hills with general drainage to the NW.; soil, stony on surface; 4<sup>th</sup>- rate; timber, scattering growth of cedars and pinon pine on  $70\frac{1}{2}$  chs.; dense growth of same on 9 chs.; scattering undergrowth of sage brush, yellow top, rabbit brush, mountain rush and grass; fair grazing,  $79\frac{1}{2}$  chs.

December 20, 1914.

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December 21, 1914: At 8<sup>h</sup> 58<sup>m</sup> a.m.l.m.t., I set off  $38^{\circ}45'$  N., on the lat. arc;  $23^{\circ}24'S.$ , on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar at the standard cor. of secs. 34 and 35, on the S. bdy. of the Tp., heretofore described.

Thence I run

N. $0^{\circ}03'E.$ , bet. secs. 34 and 35.

Over mountainous land through scant growth of scrub cedars and dense undergrowth of short shadscale, yellow top, black sage brush and scattering bunch grass.
