Chains

A pinon pine, 12 ins. dia., bears N.44° 35'W., 1.38 chs. dist., marked 1/4 S 12 B T.

A cedar, 10 ins. dia., bears S.0° 05'W., 85 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S 13 B T.

5 ft. above bottom of draw.

December 30: Sky overcast at noon; therefore unable to observe the sun on the meridian.

45.10 Top of spur, 60 ft. above 1/4 cor., projects N.10°W. about 10 chs.

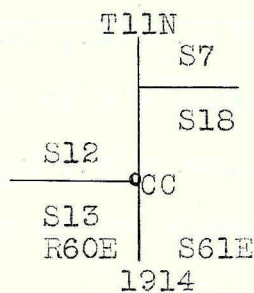
Descend.

70.76 Old stage road, Pioche to Hamilton, brs. N.5°E. and S.5° W.

Bottom of hollow, 150 ft. below top of spur, drs. N.10°E. Ascend.

73.37 Intersect E. bdy. of the TP., 2.60 chs. S. 0°45'E. of the cor. of secs. 7 and 18, heretofore described.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for closing cor. of secs. 12 and 13, with brass cap marked

A cedar, 7 ins. dia., bears S.60°W., 1.32 chs. dist., marked T 11 N R 60 E S 13 B T.

A cedar, 9 ins. dia., bears N.75°W., 2.10 chs. dist., marked T 11 N R 60 E S 12 B T.

40 ft. above bottom of hollow.

Land, rolling hills; general drainage and exposure to the NE. on W. 31 1/2 chs.; to SW. on 14 chs.; to SE. on 15 chs.; to the SW. on E. 9 chs.; soil, stony on surface; 4th rate; timber, scattering growth of cedars and pinon pine; scattering undergrowth of black sage, juniper and bunch grass; fair grazing, 72 1/2 chs.
