

Retracement and Resurvey of a portion of the
First Standard Parallel South, through R.66 E.

Chains

- Cor. stands on steep west slope of mountain, 180 ft. below the top.
- 69.35 Dry wash in bottom of canyon, 690 ft. below std. $\frac{1}{4}$ cor., 15 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains N.60°W.
Ascend.
- 74.90 Top of rocky spur, 130 ft. above bottom of canyon, projects N.15°E., about $3\frac{1}{2}$ chs.
Descend abruptly over ledges.
- 79.62 Intersect the standard cor. of secs. 34 and 35.
Cor. stands in bottom and on the east edge of Meadow Valley Canyon, 135 ft. below top of spur.
Land, very rough and mountainous; general exposure and drainage to the W. and NW.; soil, very stony on surface, of granite and porphyry formation; 4th rate; scattering growth of cedars and pinon pine on E. $36\frac{1}{2}$ chs.; no timber on W. 43 chs.; undergrowth, scattering sage brush, juniper, mountain rush, greasewood and grass; fair grazing on E. $32\frac{1}{2}$ chs.

A portion of the South boundary of T.5 S., R.66 E.

Note: On account of unurveyable land to the N., W., NE. and NW. of the W.C. of Tps. 5 and 6 S., Rs. 66 and 67 E., which stands 12.30 chs. S. of the true point for same, I initiate the survey of the south boundary of T.5 S., R.66 E., at a point on the E. bdy. of T.6 S., R.66 E.; 13.78 chs. S. of the W.C. or 26.08 chs. S. of the true point for the cor. of Tps. 5 and 6 S., Rs. 66 and 67 E. and proceed as follows:

From this point of initiation, just described, I survey West, on offset line through sec. 1 of T.6 S., R.66 E. Over rough mountainous land, through medium growth of cedars and pinon pine and scattering undergrowth of sage brush, juniper, buck brush, oak brush, service berry, mountain rush, cactus, soap weed and bunch grass.
